## Did you know...

- Fifty-five children under the age of 15 drowned in Palm Beach County from 2007 to 2017.
- Drowning is the leading cause of unintentional death for Florida children between the ages of 1 and 4.
- For every child who drowns, an estimated five nearly drown. Some of those children will need medical care for life.



## Our mission

To prevent drowning, near-drowning and other water-related incidents in Palm Beach County by educating residents on water safety and basic rescue technique.

We are a government organization that has served our community since 1996.

## Every drowning is preventable.

The majority of child drownings in Palm Beach County are due to lack of adult supervision and lack of barriers around a body of water. Most child drownings happen in backyard pools with an adult just feet away, inside a house.



## Know the ABCDs of water safety

- A Adult supervision.** Always have a responsible adult, a “water watcher,” keeping an eye on the pool.
- B Barriers.** Have code-compliant fencing around the pool, and alarms and childproof locks on doors and windows.  
**Bathtub.** Never leave a child alone.  
**Boating.** Always wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket.  
**Buckets.** Keep them stored away.
- C Classes.** Sign your child up to learn to swim!  
**CPR.** Learn it!
- D Drain Safety.** Stay away from pool drains.  
**Driving Safety.** Learn how to escape a sinking vehicle.
