## PALM TRAN HOLDS RIBBON-CUTTING EVENT TO CELEBRATE ROUTE 4 EXTENSION

Palm Tran's extended route 4 is sure to be a home run! The new extension was celebrated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony held at the Ballpark of the Palm Beaches on January 5, 2018. Launched two days later, the enhancements mean route 4 is now extended six miles via Haverhill Road in West Palm Beach to better serve the Ballpark of Palm Beaches and VA Medical Center. The extension means improved on-time performance, 20 additional bus stops and added service on Sundays. The new service is launching in time for Spring Training for the Washington Nationals and World Series Champions the Houston Astros. In attendance for the ceremony were: Palm Beach County Deputy Administrator Jon Van Arnam, Palm Tran Executive Director Clinton B. Forbes, Palm Beach County Mayor Melissa McKinlay, Palm Beach County Assistant Administrator Todd Bonlarron, Ballpark of the Palm Beaches General Manager Brady Ballard and Darren Romelus, an aide to Vice Mayor Mack Bernard.

"This additional service is a perfect example of making sure we put the needs of residents first," Palm Beach County Mayor McKinlay said. "I look forward to everyone taking advantage of this service and enjoying all the facilities in this area."

"We are talking about thousands of riders who now have improved access, not only to the ballpark but to educational opportunities, to employment opportunities, medical access and entertainment here at the stadium," Palm Tran Executive Director Clinton B. Forbes said. "Getting to this point took years of planning and teamwork as we worked closely with the Board of Commissioners."

For added convenience, Palm Tran is installing a baseball-themed shelter adjacent to the ballpark on Haverhill Road. One already exists on the Military Trail side of the ballpark. This is the third route to serve the venue and the only one with a stop at the Haverhill Road entrance to ballpark.

“This provides opportunity for visitors and residents alike,” Assistant County Administrator Bonlarron said. “No matter why a person chooses to ride route 4, having access to public transportation is always a win!”

General Manager of the Ballpark of Palm Beaches Brady Ballard said he is thrilled the ballpark will be a landmark for Palm Tran riders along route 4. He complimented Palm Tran for the support during the last year as the development of the facility took place.

“With the enhanced times and the additional stops, it’s only going to make it easier for fans of all ages and all demographics to be able to come to the Ballpark of the Palm Beaches,” he said. “We look forward to welcoming everyone with open arms especially when they are stepping off one of (Palm Tran’s) fine buses.”

In addition to new service to the Ballpark of the Palm Beaches, route 4 also now goes directly to the VA Medical Center, providing improved access to medical care. Moreover, the VA Medical Center is a key transfer point for other Palm Tran routes.

## Palm Tran Hosts Employee Recognition and Service Awards

Palm Tran held its annual Employee Recognition and Service Awards reception recently at the Madison Green Country Club to honor employees for their years of service. ## PALM TRAN OPERATIONS MANAGER RETIRES

**“PALM TRAN OPERATIONS MANAGER BJ BARROW RETIRES AFTER MORE THAN 40 YEARS”**



After nearly 42 years in Palm Beach County public transportation, including 29 years as Palm Tran Operations Manager, BJ Barrow retired in December. When Barrow started her transit career, she was an 18-year-old high school graduate who needed a job. More than four decades later, Barrow reflects on her profession marked with a plethora of memories and accomplishments.

“I had no idea at 18 I would be telling this story today,” Barrow said.

As Palm Tran Operations Manager, Barrow’s efforts earned Palm Tran numerous awards including several first-place Unit Safety awards at the Florida Public Transportation Association’s (FPTA) annual conference.

“The contributions BJ has made to transit cannot be overlooked. She has been a valuable asset for Palm Tran, and her presence will be greatly missed,” Palm Tran Executive Director Clinton B. Forbes said.

When Barrow began her career in transit in March 1976, Palm Beach County’s transit agency was known as Co-Tran. A neighbor suggested Barrow apply as a data entry clerk at the county’s newest fare reduction program for senior citizens. Barrow applied and was offered the job. She spent the bulk of her day working with the 65 years and older population.

“It was actually a great experience because I met a lot of interesting people,” she said. “They gave me words of wisdom.”

Barrow transitioned in various roles before working as an administrative assistant to the operations manager and later an operations supervisor. It was then she discovered she had a passion for the operations side of transit. After more than a decade into her career, Barrow was offered the opportunity to become operations manager by former Palm Tran Executive Director Irving Cure. Barrow admits she was hesitant to take the role. However, Cure assured her she was the best person for the job.

“He said: ‘I believe you are because you’ve had so much experience in all the different areas and you understand it, and you excel so well. I really wish you would take the opportunity,’” she remembered. “I said to him: ‘Can we write up a deal that in six months if I don’t like it, I can go back to what I was doing?’ and he’s like: ‘I’ll do it, but you don’t need that.’”

Nearly 29 years later, Barrow proved Cure right. As Palm Tran operations manager, she continuously tackled challenging safety situations – including when a passenger threatened a bus operator.

“I coached (the passenger) off the bus... Once I got him off, I knew we were okay.”

Furthermore, Barrow accomplished overseeing the expansion of Co-Tran to what is Palm Tran today.

“For 18 months, I did not take a vacation. I worked six days a week, 12 hours a day to redesign the routes. We had to redesign everything,” she said.

Despite her achievements, Barrow admits one of the biggest challenges she faced was being a woman in a man’s world back when it was far from conventional.

“Getting the respect I deserve for the position I held was very difficult especially in the early years. We’re talking about the 80s and the 90s; I had to stand my ground many times,” she said. “But I was determined I was going to stay, and I was determined I was going to do just as good of a job or better.”

“In her 40 years of experience at Palm Tran, BJ has seen and done it all,” Special Projects Coordinator Terrie James said. “She has always been willing to roll up her sleeves to get the job done, providing an excellent example of what a leader should be. Her career is a model of the success that comes from hard work and dedication, and she should be celebrated as a transit professional, representing the best of Palm Beach County.”


“Palm Tran surely misses BJ Barrow’s experience and institutional knowledge, however, we wish her the best in the next stage of her life,” Director of Operations Sean Smith said.

When asked, Barrow said she would like to be remembered as the manager who cared for others. She always left the door open for employees who needed someone to turn to.

“I want to be remembered as the one who was fair. I want to be remembered as the one who cared. I want to be remembered for being the one they could come to if they needed help and I would do my best to help them,” Barrow said.

The community and family built at Palm Tran is one Barrow will never forget. As she reflected on the pot-lucks, the retirement parties and the employees who have come and gone, she is left with gratitude and appreciation.

“Lots of good people, lots of good moments, lots of laughter amongst each other. I have to say I have zero regrets. Zero regrets of what I’ve chosen as my career, and where I’ve been and what I’ve done,” she concluded.



## PALM TRAN'S UPWARD MOBILITY PROGRAM PUTS EMPLOYEES AT THE FOREFRONT

One of the most fundamental core values of the American dream is upward mobility — that is, the opportunity to climb up the corporate ladder. However, roadblocks can often hinder even the most ambitious employees from progressing. Take Christopher Love for example. Christopher started out at Palm Tran as a bus driver, and while he enjoyed his job, he wanted to utilize his background in vehicle mechanics. When Palm Tran's mechanic technician trainee position opened up, Christopher jumped at the opportunity to apply, but he was rejected on two separate occasions.

Christopher knew he needed guidance to achieve his career goals, but did not know where to turn. Palm Tran's Upward Mobility Program provided him with the tools he needed to succeed.

Palm Tran Organizational Development Manager Liliane Finke, Ed.D. oversees the Upward Mobility Program, which guides employees in preparing for their next career moves.

"This is a unique program in the transit industry, and it exemplifies how Palm Tran as an employer invests in every employee," she said.

Liliane has a doctorate in education with a concentration in psychology. Her educational background and expertise provided the perfect foundation for the Upward Mobility Program, now entering its second year.

"The Upward Mobility Program allows us to develop our employees' skills and enables them to achieve career advancement," Palm Tran Executive Director Clinton B. Forbes said. "The program is an empowering opportunity for Palm Tran employees. It is a way of letting them know we value them, care about them and want them to grow in our company."

Christopher said the Upward Mobility Program helped him understand what he should focus on to achieve his career goals. Liliane was able to assess his needs along with the needs of Palm Tran and identify areas for improvement.

"There were certifications I needed to get that I did not know I needed. I learned more about what it took to be a more qualified candidate," Christopher explained.



Furthermore, the process helped Christopher identify his strengths and weaknesses. Through a series of confidential 30-minute sessions, Christopher learned the best way to showcase his previous experience as a mechanic at his trucking company. The sessions consisted of coaching in all areas of development.

“We understand the importance of recognizing and utilizing “soft skills,” building a team or going back to school to earn formal education credentials,” Liliane said.

Liliane explained that preparing for an interview is not just about attire or following up. It is about comparing an individual’s skills and qualifications to the job requirements. The application is a major component of that process.

“The application itself is the first step,” Liliane said. “How it is filled out is often one of the keys to success.”

The third time Christopher applied for the mechanic trainee position, he was successful.

“It made all the difference,” Christopher said. “There were too many things I was not emphasizing. I learned how to articulate more in my interviews.”

“The Organizational Development program made a huge difference for Christopher in the third interview. He really upped his game and presented himself as a well-qualified candidate. The difference was night and day,” Jon Kavaliunas, who was on the evaluation panel, said.

Since becoming a maintenance trainee, Christopher has already been promoted to maintenance technician, a feat he also attributes to the Upward Mobility Program. In the two years of the program starting, six Palm Tran employees have succeeded in receiving promotions to new positions.

“Palm Tran’s Upward Mobility Program best exemplifies our commitment and continual efforts to develop and promote an internal pool of outstanding human capital,” Senior Manager of Human Resources Cathy Lewis, who coordinates the program, said.

“Christopher’s story is about growth within Palm Tran. The Upward Mobility Program reflects a culture where we care about our employees and invest in them to better serve Palm Tran,” Forbes added.

# PALM TRAN “SHADES OF PINK” BUS RAISES AWARENESS OF BREAST CANCER IN AFRICAN-AMERICAN WOMEN

Palm Tran is determined to raise awareness and end racial disparities in breast cancer treatment. In partnership with Susan G. Komen® South Florida and Lamar Transit Advertising, Palm Tran unveiled its 2018 “Shades of Pink” bus at a ceremonial debut held in Downtown West Palm Beach on Jan. 11, 2018.

Attendees at the event included: Palm Beach County Vice Mayor Mack Bernard, Assistant County Administrator Nancy Bolton, Palm Tran Executive Director Clinton B. Forbes and Komen South Florida’s Executive Director Kate Watts. The unveiling coincided with the annual bridge lighting ceremony at the Lake Pavilion.

This is the sixth year Palm Tran has produced a bus with a special design for the organization, and this year the theme is: “Shades of Pink.” The design showcases nine local African-American breast-cancer survivors. The portraits were shot by photographer Michiko Kurisu. Many of those featured on the bus were present for the unveiling, including Karen Alleyne-Means and Tanzanika Lillard.

African-American and Caucasian women are diagnosed with breast cancer at the same rate, yet African-American women have a 41 percent higher mortality rate. Komen is bringing awareness and life-saving programs to fight the disparities in breast cancer outcomes in the African-American community.

Among the survivors whose photos appear on the bus is Vice Mayor Mack Bernard’s wife, Shawntoyia Bernard.

“I am here as a husband, and my wife is on the bus. She’s a survivor, and she was diagnosed with breast cancer eight years ago,” he said.

“We had a 2-year-old and a 1-year-old, and I was thinking: ‘What are we going to do if she doesn’t survive this?’ But I can tell you that the good Lord helped us through this, and we are here today. She’s a fighter, and she’s a warrior.”

“The bus campaign is so personal and close to my heart because of the message it signals to the world that the face of cancer -- breast cancer -- includes women that feel, love, and look just like me,” Shawntoyia Bernard said. “To African-American women, I want them to know that I am them and they are me and together let’s get healthy, let’s get checked, and let’s become more aware!”

“Armed with \$27 million in funding, Komen is targeting 10 American cities where the disparities are greatest to reduce the disparities between African-American and white women by 25 percent in five years,” Watts said.

The bus will be used primarily on route 1, which travels on US1 from the Palm Beach Gardens Mall to Camino Real in Boca Raton through April. Route 1 is Palm Tran’s busiest route, and the bus is projected to be seen by as many as 124,000 people daily.

“Our mission and hope is that many women, by seeing this bus wrap, will get checked or decide to educate and advocate for the cause,” Forbes said. “If this wrap saves just one life, we’ve achieved our goal.”

In addition to the service on Palm Tran routes, the bus will also be staged at the Susan G. Komen South Florida Race for the Cure® in Downtown West Palm Beach on Saturday, January 27, 2018. The race is expected to draw close to 10,000 participants this year.
